IS 300 INTERMEDIATE ICS FOR EXPANDING INCIDENTS

- ICS Staffing and organization to include: reporting and working relationships and information flow.
- Transfer of Command
- Unified Command functions in a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency incident
- ICS forms
- Resource Management
- Interagency mission planning and procurement
- Table Top Exercise

Managerial Level – Agency and organization management between the executive level and first level supervision; personnel who fill ICS roles as Branch Directors, Division/Group Supervisors, Unit Leaders, technical specialists, strike team and task force leaders, single resource leaders and field supervisors; midlevel Multi-Agency Coordination System personnel; EOC Section Chiefs, Branch Directors, Unit Leaders; and other emergency management/response personnel who require a higher level of ICS/NIMS Training.

During each class, ABS Instructors are going to use advance training tools to perform and improve the training:

- Emergency Response Simulator Programs
- Emergency Response Videos
- Incident Command Table Top Kit and other training tools.
